USPS Statement:

The Postal Service is aware of the recent decision by the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas regarding the ban on firearms possession on postal property, which enjoins enforcement of the ban at certain Post Offices, and the surrounding Post Office property, with respect to certain postal customers. The Postal Service is currently analyzing the court's decision and taking necessary steps to implement the injunction.
